II. Minimum credits for graduation: <u>36</u> credits (physical education and national defense education courses are not included), including: 1. Courses: minimum of required credits: <u>2</u> minimum of elective credits: <u>28</u> 2. Master's Thesis: <u>6</u> credits		Graduate students must achieve a minimum score of 70 in academic performance and conduct to pass. Students with failing conduct grades shall be expelled from the university. The average academic performance accounts for 50% of the graduation grade. *Required credits + Elective credits + Master's Thesis = minimum credits for graduation						
III. Transfer credits: maximum <u>12</u> credits (Students who have previously dropped out of the master's program or the executive master's program of our department can transfer up to <u>24</u> credits.)		In accordance with the NCHU Regulation for Credit Exemption, the application for credit exemption must be submitted before the deadline for course add/drop in the first semester of enrollment.						
IV. Undergraduate credits from discipline-related courses may be counted toward graduate program graduation credits.		In accordance with the NCHU Regulations on Course Registration, the credits and courses that graduate students are required to take each semester must be approved by their advisor or the chairperson/director of the department, graduate institute, or degree program. If necessary for their studies, graduate students may take relevant undergraduate courses beyond the required credits of their department (graduate institute, degree program) with the consent of the course instructor. To have these courses counted toward graduation credits, approval must be obtained from their advisor and the relevant meetings of the department, graduate institute, or degree program. However, a maximum of 6 credits is allowed. If graduate students take advanced courses as defined by the NCHU Regulations for Curriculum Planning and Course Opening, a maximum of 12 credits can be counted. (Our department resolved in the 2nd Doctoral and Master's Degree Examination Committee Meeting of the 2nd Semester of the 104th Academic Year on June 22, 2016, that undergraduate credits will not be counted toward graduation credits.)

VII. Prerequisite Courses (not included in graduation credits): ____credits 1. 2. 3.		In accordance with the NCHU Master's Program Regulations, the department chairperson (director) and the graduate student's advisor determine the undergraduate prerequisite courses that graduate students must complete. Prerequisite credits will not be counted toward graduation credits, and students cannot take the thesis defense before passing the prerequisite courses.						

VIII. Thesis Defense: (Master's Degree Examination) 1. Graduate students must appoint their advisor by the end of their first enrollment year. 2. Graduate Students must obtain a certificate of completion for the "Education on Academic and Research Ethics" course before applying for the thesis defense. Each department (graduate institute or degree program) determines the qualifications for this requirement. 3. Graduate Students who have completed the minimum years of enrollment, required courses, and credits and have finished the draft of their thesis may apply for the thesis defense. The application must be submitted at least 20 days before the scheduled defense date, following the semester's enrollment procedure and course registration. The passing grade for the defense is 70.	The thesis defense score accounts for 50% of the graduation grade. Graduate students may complete self-directed learning and pass the final test on the "Center for Taiwan Academic Research Ethics Education" website to obtain a certificate of completion. If a department (graduate institute or degree program) requires participation in professional academic research ethics education courses, such requirements will be implemented by the specific regulations set by the department (graduate institute or degree program). Students who fail the thesis defense may apply for a retake in the following semester or academic year if the study period has not yet expired. Students who fail the retake will be expelled from the university. The grade of those who pass retaking the thesis defense is uniformly calculated at 70.
IX. Others: 1. English Proficiency Graduation Requirement: As resolved in the 193rd Department Affairs Meeting on August 6, 2008, this department's English proficiency graduation requirement is as follows: Master's and Doctoral Program: The advisor determines the requirement based on academic needs. 2. Students who are not graduates of a department related to Chinese literature must take 2 required courses (full-year courses) from the department's bachelor's program or continuing bachelor's program after enrollment. The credits will not be counted toward graduation credits. Students are not allowed to take the thesis defense before passing the courses. 3. The maximum number of credits recognized for courses taken mutually by master's program students and executive master's program students is <u>15</u> credits.	In accordance with Article 2 of the NCHU Guidelines for Including English Proficiency as a Graduation Requirement, departments and institutes are authorized to establish their own English proficiency graduation requirements for graduate students. (Enacted in the 57th Academic Affairs Meeting on March 26, 2009)
